Shahu Maharaj was crowned as a King of Kolhapur State, on 2nd April, 1894 in the presence of Governor Lord Harris. Unlike any other King, Shahu Maharaj did not just lead a Royal Life, but he had a vision to see what was happening around him in the society, beyond the palace life. He had understood the problems of the grass root citizens of his State and his Nation, before and after the British rule. Hence before understanding the contribution of Chh. Shahu Maharaj to the causes of women in our society, it becomes necessary to know briefly, the social history of the contemporary society.

Radhakrishnan's concern for experience and his extensive knowledge of the Western philosophical and literary traditions has earned him the reputation of being a bridge-builder between India and the West.




7. Karantijyoti Savitribai Phule Birth Anniversary – 03rd January 2021

Shri Bibhishan Ghadage garlanded the the image of Krantijvoti Savitribai Phule Karantijyoti Savitribai Phule and her husband Jyotirao Phule had opened India's first school for women in Pune in 1848. Jyotirao Phule was an advocate of female education and helped his wife who married him when she was 9 years old attain good education against all odds. Karantijyoti Savitribai not only became the first female teacher in India but went on to set up 17 more schools. She was actively involved with the lives of the students and regularly conducted meetings with parents to emphasize the importance of education for girls. On 3rd January, 1831, Krantijyoti Savitribai Phule was born in a village called Naigaon in the Satara district of Maharashtra. The year 2022 marks the 190th birth anniversary of Savitribai Phule. The day is observed in Maharashtra as Balika Din. She started the first-ever school for girls in India in 1848 at Bhide Wada, Pune. Jyotirao Phule, her husband, was one of the pillars of support. Phule encouraged women to attend school by offering them stipends. Although most of the schools were for upper-caste women, Savitribai and Jyotirao set up schools for Dalit and lower-caste women as well. She opened a well for 'untouchables' at her residence in a defiant act against the caste system and also started a care centre for pregnant rape victims called 'Balhatya Pratibandhak Griha'. Phule also set up a 'Mahila Seva Mandal' where women would gather and she would raise awareness about women's rights

8. National Youth Day - 12 January 2021

Dr. Vanita Machave and Smt. Dipali Ghodake garlanded the images of Rajmata Jijau

and Swami Vivekanand. National Youth Day is celebrated in Manavlok's College of Social Work, Ambajogai on 12 January to commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. day was declared by Government of India in 1984 while the event was first celebrated in 1985. The main aim behind this is to make sure that the students across the country can be encouraged to learn about the life, the ideas and philosophy of Swami Vivekananda and apply them in their lives. Swami Vivekananda was a 19th century spiritual leader who was born

in Kolkata on 12 January, 1863, as Narendra Nath Dutta. He was a social reformer who was dedicated to eliminating child marriage and illiteracy and to spread education among women and the people belonging to lower castes. He also worked towards awakening religious consciousness among the people. National Youth Day is observed to honour the ideals and thoughts of Swamiji Vivekananda who had tremendous faith in youth. Vivekananda always highlighted the role of youth in the process of nation-building and inspired them to have a confident attitude. In1893, Vivekananda represented India at the World Parliament of Religion in Chicago. During the speech, he highlighted the importance of abolishing fanaticism in all forms. He introduced to love and empathy put forward by Hinduism. Swami Vivekananda had received a standing ovation by the crowd for his speech. To honor his contributions to the country, the Indian government in 1984 announced that 12 January will be observed as National Youth Day. The aim was to imbibe the youth especially students with Vivekananda's philosophy and ideals. The day is also observed to promote rational thinking among the youth.Swami Vivekananda was born on 12 January 1863 in Kolkata of West Bengal and was named Narendra Nath Datta. Vivekananda's father Vishwanath Dutt was a lawyer, while his mother Bhuvaneshwari Devi was a homemaker. After the death of his guru Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Vivekananda gave up all his worldly pleasures and became a monk. He always spread the message of peace, love and empathy. Every year, several events and seminars are organised on National Youth Day. Vivekananda's thoughts and lectures are discussed during these events.

9. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada Name Extension Day

The University Flag was hoisted by Shri Annasaheb Roham, Member of Executive Board of Manavlok. Dalit Panther was formed in 1972. The Dalit Panther movement was started for some demands like acquisition of Gairan lands, increase in student scholarships. At the same time, Dr. Marathwada University of Aurangabad.

10) Chh. Shivaji Maharaj Birth Anniversary

Dr. Prakash Jadhav, Principal, Manavlok's College of Social Work, garlanded the image of Chh. Shivaji Maharaj. Born to Jijabai and Shahji Bhonsle on February 19, 1630 in Pune's Shivneri Durg, Shivaji Raje Bhosle or Shivaji, is regarded as the greatest warrior king of the

Maratha empire. Every year, "Shiv Jayanti" is celebrated with great favor in Maharashtra and other parts of the country to mark the Maratha king's birth anniversary on February 19. On his 392nd birth anniversary today, here are some interesting facts about Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. Shivaji worked for the needy and poor and established a great civil rule in his region. He encouraged the poor to join his army, offering them an opportunity to climb up the social ladder. Shivaji respected



religions alike. He never attacked any religious place. He accommodated all the religions without compromising on his own Hindu religious beliefs. Many of his trusted warriors were Muslims. Shivaji was against forceful religious conversions. He planned his daughter Sakhubai's wedding with Mahadji, the son of Bajaajirao Naik Nimbalkar, who was converted to Islam by Aurangazeb. During the ceremony, he encouraged Bajaajirao to return to Hinduism. Shivaji was probably the first king in the region to understand the role of naval fleet to protect his motherland from foreign invasion. He even built naval forts at Jaigarh, Vijaydurg, Sindhudurg and many other places at the coastline to protect the Konkan region.



11) Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Birth Anniversary

Shri. Madhav Chivale and Shri Namdev Kappe alumni of the college garlanded the image of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar. Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar was born in 1891 in Mhow, Central Province

Madhya Pradesh). Ambedkar led a crusade for the upliftment and empowerment of Dalits in the country. He earned doctorates in economics from premier institutes like the Columbia University and the London School of Economics. He was a scholar in disciplines like law, economics and political science. Babasaheb became a key advocate and campaigner for India's independence from the British rule. He published scores of iournals and advocated for Dalits rights. He also made significant



contributions toward the establishment of the state of India, drafting of the Constitution and giving ideas that served as the foundation of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).In 1956, Ambedkar converted to Buddhism. Ambedkar suffered from diabetes and was bed-ridden for a brief time in 1954. The following year, his health worsened. Ambedkar completed the final manuscript of his book on Buddhism 'The Buddha and His Dhamma' in December 1956. Three days later, on 6 December, he passed away in his sleep at his home in Delhi.

However, the young, ambitious bright and man moved willingly to various nearby places in his quest to acquire education. His heart and soul were focused and dedicated towards the development of individual spirit and the benefit to society. It was with this indomitable spirit that he "Janta established. Shiskshan

Prasarak Mandal" in Pusad. The Janta Shikshan Prasarak Mandal focuses on educating the natives from Primary Levels to the Higher Education in all most all the branches of knowledge. Vasantrao, also known by his friends as V.P., entered the arena of politics in early 1951. The credit of one of the most developed state in India goes to Late V.P.Late Sri. Naik was an agriculturist to the core. Since, he himself was from an agricultural background, he was aware of the plight of the farmer. He wanted to change their gloomy picture and so focused strongly on the farming sector

Ambajogai.On 12th December 1954 a meeting was organized bv Marathwada Shikshan Samiti in which emphasis was given on separate University for the purpose of cultural and Educational activities Two Convention ofmembers ofParliament and of the State Legislature in 1955-1956 strongly represented the need for University on 29th July 1956 A delegation of members of Parliament and of the State Legislature and educationists in

Marathwada submitted memorandum to the Chief Minister of Hyderabad State Making a similar demand, the Government of Hyderabad appointed a committee. The committee submitted its report and on 27th October 1956 the Council of Ministers recorded its view that it was strongly of the opinion that a separate University for Marathwada area should be established.
